

<u>Lesson Plan – What are the unwritten rules?</u>

Purpose: Explore fairness by viewing our values through different perspectives. Recognise how others feel in different circumstances and how this empathy may affect decisions-making.

Equipment needed: Pen, Paper, computer, projector.
